

Revd. Canon Miriam writes:

Dear Friends,

I think that if I had to choose a favourite season it would have to be spring.

As I walk my dog Bodie I love to see the green shoots appearing on the trees, spring flowers bursting from a dull brown earth and the blossom on the trees. The breaking forth of new life makes us notice once again how amazing creation is and speaks so much to us about our amazing and generous creator God. We are so blessed with the rhythm of the seasons each with its own beauty and character to inspire and encourage us. There is nothing like a sunny spring day to lift us out of the gloom of winter and fill us with hope as the cycle of nature sheds its winter cloak.

The church calendar is also split into seasons with each season focusing on the life of Jesus and gifting us with different opportunities to explore and deepen our faith. We have just entered the season of Lent. Falling at the end of winter/beginning of spring, it provides us with an opportunity to nurture new life in our own lives, to look for God's springtime in us and to focus on Jesus' amazing life and sacrificial love. Our faith should not be static. Each day brings us new opportunities, we learn new things about ourselves all the time, regardless of our age. God journeys with us through the highs and lows of life, guiding, encouraging, teaching, nurturing and loving us. Every experience, every challenge we face teaches us more about ourselves and God's never ending love. Lent is an opportunity to take time to reflect on God at work in our lives and in the world and to be open to what he might be asking of us at this point in our lives.

Lent starts with the account of Jesus being driven into the wilderness after his baptism for 40 days. During this time he struggled with all the sorts of things that we would struggle with, the loneliness,

hunger, uncertainty etc and Satan tried to take advantage by tempting him away from God's will to allay his hunger, anxieties and loneliness by thinking only of his own needs and popularity. Jesus stood firm knowing that God's will was what he needed to follow even in difficult times. For us Lent can be a time when we try to take a step back and look objectively at our own life, where have we fallen prey to go our own way, to trust more in our own abilities rather than trusting God, where our own selfish accumulation of things has blinded us to the needs of others and the welfare of our planet.

I wonder how you might be keeping Lent this year, how you are seeking to grow and deepen your faith in God. Perhaps it is using the Church of England daily reflection booklet/app Dust and Glory, or maybe you are attending the Churches Together Lent course. Maybe you have committed yourself to carving out some quiet time each day or perhaps you have set yourself a challenge such as quietly doing a Random Act of Kindness every day in Lent. On the first day of Lent, we distributed Lent Bags to everyone in the congregation which included a reflection for each week of Lent along with an object such as sand, stone candle, cross etc which you can perhaps keep in a special place at home to help you journey through Lent. If you were not in church on the Sunday they were distributed and would like one do let me know.

If you would like to chat over a coffee (or something stronger) about your journey of faith or anything that concerns you then do please get in touch with me, Revd. Paul or Revd. Anne, we would love to have an opportunity to speak with you on a one to one basis.







Church Electoral Roll Revision

The annual revision of the Church Electoral Roll will be made during the week of Monday 27th March to Friday 31st March in preparation for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on Sunday 23rd April 2022, following the morning service.

If you are a lay person, baptised, are aged 16 years or older and resident in the Parish or, if not resident, you attend services at All Saints', you are eligible to be on the Electoral Roll as a lay member. Existing members will remain on the Roll unless they signify their wish to withdraw. Application forms for enrolment with an information pack will be available in the Church and the Parish Office from Sunday 12th March onwards or can be obtained from me (contact details below).

Being on the Electoral Roll is important as it signifies a commitment to membership of All Saints' and enables you to vote for the election of members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and the Deanery Synod at the APCM and also to stand for election yourself. The PCC works with the Vicar to serve and run the Parish. If you wish to be included on the Electoral Roll, please complete a form which you will find at the back of the Church.

Please place your completed form in a sealed envelope and hand it to Revd. Miriam, to me or to Judith in the Parish Office on or before Friday 31st March. The revised list of those enrolled on the Electoral Roll will be available for your perusal at the back of the Church for two weeks commencing Sunday 12th April, prior to the APCM.



All in the month of March

It was:

65 years ago, on 2nd March 1958, that the first land crossing of Antarctica was completed by the Commonwealth Trans-Antarctic Expedition, led by Vivian Fuchs. The team of 12 men travelled 2,158 miles from Shackleton Base to Scott Base (via the South Pole) in 99 days, using six vehicles.

100 years ago, on 4th March 1923, that Patrick Moore, the amateur astronomer, TV presenter, writer and musician was born. Best known for presenting the TV astronomy show *The Sky at Night* for over 50 years. (Died 2012)

300 years ago, on 8th March 1723, that Sir Christopher Wren, English architect, died. Best known for designing St Paul's Cathedral.

125 years ago, on 16th March 1898, that Aubrey Beardsley, British illustrator, died. His black ink drawings, influenced by Japanese woodcuts, contributed to the development of Art Nouveau.

70 years ago, on 19th March 1953, that the Academy Awards ceremony (the Oscars) were televised for the first time.

Also 70 years ago, on **26th March 1953**, that Dr Jonas Salk announced that he had completed the first small-scale test of a polio vaccine. Larger tests began in February 1954, and mass vaccinations began in April 1955.

25th March: Lady Day or The Annunciation

This beautiful event (Luke 1:26-38) took place in Nazareth, when Mary is already betrothed to Joseph. The Archangel Gabriel comes to Mary, greets her as highly favoured, tells her not to be afraid, that she will bear a son Jesus, and that her elderly cousin

Elizabeth is already pregnant (with John the Baptist).

The church calendar is never quite as neat as some would like it. To celebrate the Annunciation on 25th March does indeed place the conception of Jesus exactly nine months from His birth on 25th December, but the latter part of March almost inevitably falls during Lent. But the birth and death of Jesus are intrinsically linked - He was born to die, and thus fulfil God's purposes.

The Annunciation is a significant date in the Christian calendar - it is one of the most frequent depicted in Christian art. Gabriel's gracious strength and Mary's humble dignity have inspired many artists. Certainly, Mary's response to the angel has for centuries been an example of good faith in practice - humility, enquiry of God, and trusting acceptance in His will for her life.



31st March John Donne, the metaphysical poet



John Donne (1572 – 1631) was an English poet, scholar, soldier, secretary and finally Dean of St Pauls Cathedral in London. But he is most remembered for his poetry, for he is seen as the greatest of the 17th century 'metaphysical' poets.

Donne was born in 1572 into a Roman Catholic family in London at a time when the Church of England was the dominant faith, and those who remained Roman Catholic were considered second class

citizens. Although Donne studied at both Oxford and Cambridge, because of his Roman Catholicism, he was denied a degree. So, in 1592 Donne went to London to study law at Lincoln's Inn.

In 1594 Donne decided to convert to the Church of England, and this opened up a whole new life for him. In 1596 he joined the naval expedition led by the Earl of Essex against Cadiz in Spain. When he returned in 1598, he was appointed private secretary to Sir Thomas Egerton, Lord Keeper of the Seal. All was going well, but then he fell in love with Egerton's 16-year-old niece, Anne More, and in 1601 he secretly married her. Egerton was furious, and Donne lost his job, and even ended up in prison for a short time.

For several years after that Donne worked as a lawyer. Then in 1610 he wrote a book encouraging Roman Catholics to take the Oath of Allegiance to the king. The book caught the eye of James 1, who may have suggested that Donne go into the Church. Certainly, Donne was appointed as a royal chaplain only a few months after his ordination in 1615.

In 1617 Donne's beloved wife, Anne, died. In 1621 he was appointed the Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, and proved to be a much loved and inspiring preacher.

Throughout his working life, Donne continued to write poetry, though most of it remained unpublished until 1633. It was then

mostly forgotten after his death, until early last century. Then, in the 1920s, both Ezra Pound and TS Eliot openly acknowledged their literary debt to him.

Donne's place as one of the greatest of the 17thcentury 'metaphysical' poets is now assured. He wrote both sacred and secular poetry, with his main theme being that of human love and divine love.




