Revd. Canon Miriam writes:

Dear Friends

Autumn is upon us! I know this because when I wake up in the morning it is dark and I know that in just 3-4 weeks it will be too dark for me to go out for my early morning walk across the fields

with my dog Bodie. I will really miss these walks because in the quietness of the morning, when there is no-one else around and Bodie is off exploring different scents to chase, I always have such a powerful sense of God walking alongside me as I ponder on the day ahead offering all that is to be in prayer to God. Having said this, I do rather like autumn. The vibrant colours of the leaves as they change, the sense of nature starting its hibernation period and the changes in our liturgical seasons in Church bring a real sense of stability and comfort.

I am mindful that some people may approach the seasons of autumn and winter with a sense of dread. The long dark nights and cold days can be difficult, especially for those who live on their own. Added to this, the decision by the Government to remove the annual heating allowance from people over 66 who do not receive pension credit may be a real cause for concern regarding how people can keep their homes adequately heated and themselves warm. Can I remind you that, as a Church, we do have some funds available that are not part of the funding used for general Church purposes, to assist you in paying heating or any other bills. If at any time you find yourself struggling financially, please speak to me.

This magazine has two months worth of information covering October and November so please keep it somewhere safe as you will find dates for the different services and activities going right into December.

Autumn is always a busy time in Church and you may want to make a note of some special services and activities coming up during October and November...

The Blessing of Animals Service will be on Sunday 20th October at 11.30am.

Notes from the PCC Meeting 4th September 2024

Maintenance and Improvements to the Church Organ

Recent work by the organ builder, Tarquin Wiggins, to fix some issues with the organ has produced marked improvements in its performance. The Music Maintenance and Development Committee, on 5th August, considered a number of options and recommended the PCC to explore a limited programme of repairs and improvements designed to ensure the organ remained a reliable instrument for at least several years. Following on from that, the PCC received a prioritised list of desirable repairs and improvements produced by Simon Dunn, one of our current organists. The PCC has agreed to fund additional work, to be undertaken by Mr Wiggins, to carry out some of the highest-priority repairs and improvements during the autumn. The Music Maintenance and Development Committee will also receive regular reports on the organ's condition and performance.

Finance Report

At the end of August, the Church account showed a deficit of $\pounds 5,626$ while Hall account income exceeded expenditure by $\pounds 2,008$, producing a net deficit of $\pounds 3,618$. This is in line with the budget forecast for 2024. Offertory income is down slightly and Hall repairs and maintenance spending is up, but donations and Hall lettings income are both ahead of their budgeted figures. Much will depend on the income from the Beer Festival in October and the Christmas Market with the Prize Draw in November.

Safeguarding : Safety and Security of Access to the Hall for User Groups

Following concerns expressed by a children's activities group using the Hall, Anne Oke (Safeguarding Officer) and Wendy Shafe (Hall Committee Chair) produced letters of guidance to organisers of children's and adult groups who regularly use the Hall to ensure that access to the Hall facilities (toilets and the kitchen) are not available while children and vulnerable adults are using the Hall, while the facilities remain accessible when services and other activities are taking place in the Church. Information on times of restricted access will be notified to all Hall key holders, while regular Hall users will be kept informed of services and activities taking place in the Church.

Health and Safety Policy 2024

The PCC adopted an updated Health and Safety Policy for 2024 which sets out who is responsible for the overall management and also for detailed aspects of the Plan, including activities and records. As part of the overall plan, an evacuation exercise of the Church will be held following a service on a date to be arranged. You have been put on notice!

Visits by Archdeacon Charles on 24th and 27th October

Archdeacon Revd. Charles Hudson, Archdeacon of St Albans, will be visiting All Saints' on 24th and Sunday 27th October. He will meet PCC members informally on 24th October and will conduct and preach at the 9.45am Communion Service on 27th October.

The Church Recording Society

This Society has offered to visit All Saints' and produce a comprehensive record of our Church buildings, at no cost to the parish, which will be presented with a book of reference when the survey has been completed. They have already surveyed more than 2,000 other churches. John Galloway will act as our contact with the Society.

Kitchen Dishwasher

The Hall Committee considered the usefulness of the dishwasher following a recent service. The machine takes a long time to heat and is therefore not economical to use for smaller events such as the Friday Café. In addition, the trays are cumbersome and heavy to load and unload when washed and the washing process does not remove stains from the cups. The Committee considered that the dishwasher should be used only for larger social events such as the Harvest barbecue, Christmas market etc,

Pastoral and Evangelism Group

The Group was informed that planned Nurturing Newborns + course scheduled to start in October has been postponed until the New Year; the summer holiday Pop-up Cafés for under-5s have been very popular and the Christmas Afternoon Tea will take place on Friday 20th December, with no Morning Café on that date.

Social and Fundraising Committee

The Committee has been planning the Parish Barbecue on 15th September, the Beer Festival on 11th-13th October and the Christmas Market on 16th November. Sign-up lists for volunteers to help at the Beer Festival and the Christmas Market are available at the back of the Church. Do sign up if you can, as helpers are badly needed.
