Revd. Canon Miriam writes:

Dear Friends,

August is a time for holidays (if you have children at school) and rest. It is that point in the summer when the pace of life seems to slow a little and we

can enjoy the sunny days and light evenings. It is a time for us to relax and reflect maybe on our faith journey and relationship with God. In our busyness, it is often so easy to get out of the rhythm of spending time with God each day in prayer, reading or just 'being' in his presence. I hope and pray that over the coming weeks you will be able to re-discover the presence, the joy and the love of God in your life.

It was lovely to welcome so many people to our Cake and Conversation event back in May. The purpose of this event was to reflect on our life together as a church community and how we live and share the love and presence of God with the people of Croxley Green. It is clear from the conversations that we had that God has richly blessed us in all that we seek to do in his name. This is evidenced by the number of new people who have joined us and the comments of people who come to the various social events that we hold. Thank you so much for being a part of this community and for all that you do.

Over the last few months, the Ministry Team, Pastoral and Evangelism Group and the PCC have been reflecting on the comments that were shared at this event and prayerfully exploring with God what we should do to enable the further growth, development and witness of our church community. An area that seems to come up in these prayerful times is the need for us as a community to deepen our faith and understanding of God's call so that we can be more effective in bringing others to faith in God. With this in mind, we are planning to explore some of life's difficult questions, and we hope that you will come along and join the debate/ discussion.

Entitled 6 Big Questions, over 6 weeks starting on 1st October at 7.30pm, we will explore the following;

In the Beginning...Was it God or was it Science? (1st October)

Why do bad things happen? (8th October)

What happens when we die? (15th October)

Does prayer work? (22nd October)

Why be a Christian? (29th October)

Why go to church? (12th November)

In addition to the above, we are also planning a series of sermons looking at Journeys of Faith of well-known people in the Bible. Recognising these were ordinary people with the same challenges, problems, fears and dubious character traits will hopefully help us to understand that God calls and equips all sorts of people to follow him. These sermons will take place during September and October, and we will be looking at the stories of Peter, Rahab, Ruth, Amos, Moses, Judas, the Woman at the Well and Paul. We would love to hear your feedback about these sermons, so do speak to those who have preached them about the characters and whether their journey of faith has inspired you.

On November 18th, in the evening, we will be hosting the Deanery Confirmation Service here at All Saints'. If you would like to know more about being confirmed please speak to me. We are running a confirmation class for young people too starting in September, again speak to me If this is something you would like to know more about.

Our Harvest Festival Service will take place on 21st September at 9.45am. Our harvest gifts will be given to the Rickmansworth Food Bank which has a branch here in Croxley Green. Look out for information in my weekly letters about what foods they would like to receive.



I told everyone how much I loved it and I asked if I could do it again when my mum is ordained a deacon next year and they said "of course you can!" I can't wait!

A Bee Prayer

Thank you God for all the bees for all our food from cheese to peas. Help us to look after bees with care, and other insects in this world we share. Amen

Bees are essential to our natural world. Honey bees in particular are super-important pollinators for flowers, fruits and vegetables. This means that they help other plants grow! Bees transfer pollen between the male and female parts, allowing plants to grow seeds and fruit.

Here are some thoughts from 'The Friends of the Earth' that show us how important bees are to us and help us to think about adding lots of bee friendly plants to our gardens that offer both pollen and nectar e.g. Some popular choices include Lavender, Borage, Salvia,

sunflowers and various herbs like rosemary and thyme. When selecting plants, consider those with open, accessible flowers as they are easier for bees to access.



'What did you have for breakfast today? Jam on toast? Grilled tomatoes with your fry-up? Maybe fruit juice or a coffee? It's tempting to think bees just provide us with honey – but in fact they're behind much of the food we eat, including most fruit and vegetables.

From pub signs and town names, from Shakespeare to JK Rowling, from beehive hair-dos to phrases like "having a bee in your bonnet" – the bee has been a star for centuries. Roman philosopher Pliny referred to honey as "the sweat of the heavens and the saliva of the stars", while Medieval author and poet Chaucer was one of the first to use the phrase "busy as bees". The bumblebee has always been a source of special delight because of its portly features and furry bottom. Mr Bumble in Oliver Twist and Dumbledore (a Cornish word for bumblebee) in Harry Potter suit their names well.

Bees are crucial to our economy – without them it would cost UK farmers £1.8 billion a year to pollinate their crops. In a world without bees, our food would cost a lot more to produce and our economy would suffer. More bee information can be found on several websites including Friends of the Earth and Bee Keepers Association

If you would like to know more facts about bees, take a walk around the Bee Trail in the Church garden, then pop into Church and read the prayers that the First Sunday children and their mums and dads wrote on bee shapes during last month's service. Maybe write your own prayer on a bee.

All in the month of August from Parish Pump

It was 1,700 years ago, on 25th August 325, that the First Council of Nicaea ended with the adoption of the Nicene Creed. It summarised the Christian faith and established the doctrine of the Holy Trinity.

250 years ago, on 5th August 1775, that the first Europeans entered San Francisco Bay.

Spanish explorer Juan de Ayala and his crew on the ship San Carlos explored and mapped the bay.

150 years ago, on 4th August 1875, that Hans Christian Andersen, Danish writer, died. Best known for his fairy tales, such as *The Emperor's New Clothes, The Little Mermaid, The Princess and the Pea, The Snow Queen, The Ugly Duckling,* and many more.

100 years ago, on 5th August 1925, that the Welsh nationalist political party Plaid Cymru was founded. Today it holds four of the 32 Welsh seats in the UK Parliament, 12 of the 60 seats in the Senedd, and 202 of the 1,231 principal local authority councillors.

90 years ago, on 21st August 1935, that John Hartley, British tennis player, died. He was the only clergyman ever to win Wimbledon, and in fact he was world number 1 player in both 1879 and 1880 – winning Wimbledon both years.

75 years ago, on 15th August 1950, that Princess Anne, the Princess Royal, was born.

65 years ago, on 6th August 1960, that the Twist became a national sensation in the US, and triggered one of the biggest dance crazes, when singer Chubby Checker performed the song on the show American Bandstand.

60 years ago, on 6th August 1960, that the Beatles' Album *HELP!* was released.

Also 50 years ago, on 20th August 1975, that NASA launched its Viking 1 space probe on a mission to Mars. It became the first spacecraft to land successfully on Mars, and to complete its mission.

30 years ago, on 24th August 1995, that Microsoft released both Windows 95 operating systems and also Microsoft Office 95.




