**Revd. Canon Miriam writes:**

Dear Friends,

March always strikes me as the month that brings hope. The worst of the winter weather is behind us (usually), gardens and hedgerows, that for so long have been uninspiring shades of brown and dull green, suddenly become alive with colour as snowdrops, crocuses, daffodils and tree blossom begin to appear. Daylight hours are getting longer, and we look forward to enjoying time outdoors as the weather improves. March also encompasses the season of Lent. A season when we are urged to reflect on our journey of faith, opening ourselves to recognise and respond to God's gentle nudges as he seeks to shape and mould us into the person he has created us to be. Sometimes our journey of faith seems to bound along effortlessly with us experiencing a real sense of God's love and presence with us in all that we do. Other times that journey feels like we are trudging up a steep mountain that is covered in cloud and we are not sure how we will get through it or what will be revealed when the clouds eventually clear. And there are times when perhaps we feel that we are at a standstill, and we are not sure how to take the next step, or we fear what might be asked of us if we take a step forward. We all go through these stages in our journey of faith many times, painful though they may be sometimes they are actually formative as God gently leads us closer to him.

I recently came across a prayer written by Thomas Merton (1915-1968). Merton was a well-known and much respected theologian, monk, mystic, poet, and social activist. He wrote more than 50 books in a period of 27 years, mostly on spirituality, social justice and pacifism. This poem/reflection sums up the challenges that I think many of us experience during Lent:

My Lord God,  
I have no idea where I am going.  
I do not see the road ahead of me.  
I cannot know for certain where it will end.

Nor do I really know myself,  
and the fact that I think I am following Your will  
does not mean that I am actually doing so.  
But I believe that the desire to please You  
does in fact please You.  
And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing.  
I hope that I will never do anything  
apart from that desire.  
And I know that, if I do this,  
You will lead me by the right road,  
though I may know nothing about it.  
Therefore I will trust You always  
though I may seem to be lost  
and in the shadow of death.  
I will not fear,  
for You are ever with me,  
and You will never leave me  
to face my perils alone. Amen.  
– *Thomas Merton, Thoughts in Solitude,*

Don't forget that if you want to chat about your journey of faith or if you have any questions about God or the bible, myself, Paul or Tolu would be very happy to chat with you over a coffee.

There are a number of events and services happening during March which I hope you will be able to attend. On Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March Churches Together are funding an event called Circus Praise Party here at All Saints' Church starting at 3pm. It will be led by Duggie Dug Dug (Doug Horley). Doug has a national and international ministry working with children. He has a vision to see Jesus lighting a flame in the hearts of children that will spread like wildfire. Doug's heart is to present the gospel in fun, lively ways and to challenge children to build their friendship with God and to realise how important they are to him. This is going to be an amazing event, and I do hope that people will come along with their children/ grandchildren/ nieces/ nephews. You can book via a QR code available on posters advertising the event on display in the Church and the Hall and on page 14. The price of the ticket is only £1!!

Don't forget **Mothering Sunday on 15<sup>th</sup> March**. We will have a special service at 9.45am for people of all ages where we will distribute flowers to everyone. I do hope you will come and join us at this event.

Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> March is Palm Sunday, the start of Holy Week. During Holy Week we journey with Jesus through the events that led Him to His crucifixion, death and Resurrection. Over the course of the week there are services every day and I strongly encourage you to attend as many of these as you can so that you can experience spiritually and emotionally the events of this momentous week. Whilst some of the events are challenging, they are also transformative and not only deepen our relationship with God but with each other deepening our understanding of what it means to be part of a Christian community. The following descriptions will hopefully give you some idea of what to expect.

**Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday 29th March.** At our 9.45am service of Holy Communion we will remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, the joy of the crowds as they shouted and rejoiced at the arrival of Jesus waving palm branches and laying down their coats. We will all receive a Palm Cross and, weather permitting, process outside the Church. In the evening, the choir will lead us in a service called 'The Cross of Christ'. This service of beautiful music and traditional Passiontide hymns provides an opportunity for reflective worship as we prepare ourselves for the week ahead.

**On Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March** at 7.30pm there will be a short reflective service in Church which will focus on Healing and Reconciliation. There will be an opportunity for people to receive the laying on of hands and prayers for healing at this service.

**On Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> March** at 7pm we gather in Church for our Holy Week meal. Picking up lots of the elements of a Passover Meal, this time of fellowship and worship enables us to gain greater understanding of the words used by Jesus which feature in our services of Holy Communion: 'Jesus blessed you Father for the food...he took bread, blessed it... and gave it to his disciples saying "Take, eat. This is my body given for you" after blessing the cup of wine he shared it with his disciples saying " Drink this all of you... this is my blood of the new covenant, shed for you all...drink this to remember me."'

The meal is a joyful event reminding us that Passover Meals are a celebration of God delivering the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. So, we celebrate as we hear again this amazing story. There is laughter, singing and good food so do come along. There will be a sign-up sheet in Church nearer the time if you are able to come.

**On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April** at 7.30pm there will be a short reflective service in Church with an opportunity of Anointing using special Holy Oil. The purpose of the anointing in this context, is to seek God's blessing on our commitment to journey with Him through Holy Week. Jesus was himself was anointed by a woman as he journeyed to Jerusalem.

**On Maundy Thursday, 2<sup>nd</sup> April** there is a service at St Albans Cathedral at 11am where Readers and clergy from across the Diocese attend to renew the promises that they made at the licensing/ordination. The Bishop will also bless the Holy Oils to be used in churches across the diocese for anointing those newly baptised, confirmed, the sick and the dying. This service is open to everyone, and each church is encouraged to take along people from their congregation. It is a beautiful, uplifting service and I encourage you to come along. Look out for a sign-up sheet that will be at the back of church from the beginning of March so that we can coordinate lifts and travel together.

In the evening, at 7.30pm, we have our service of Holy Communion with the washing of feet and vigil, and we are delighted that we will once again be joined by people from St Oswald's and the Baptist Church. For this service, the Altar is placed in the nave with the congregation sitting round it to bring to the fore the intimacy of the last meal that Jesus had with his disciples before his arrest. We remember Jesus, kneeling down and washing his disciples' feet. There will be an opportunity for those who wish to have their feet washed. For those who feel uncomfortable about having their feet washed there will also be an opportunity to receive this gift of love through having their hands washed instead. After Communion, the Altars are stripped and all colour removed from the Church. At the end of the service the choir lead us (in a non-formal way!) singing the Taizé chant 'Stay here, remain here with me, watch and pray' to the part of the Church that has been set up as a garden (to represent Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane,) where we can sit and keep vigil for as long as we wish. The vigil ends at 10pm. This is a deeply meaningful and moving service, I do hope that you will be able to join us.

**Good Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April** starts with the traditional Ecumenical Walk of Witness. Beginning at 9.30am outside the computer shop in Watford Road (near the garage). We walk through the village with stops on the way for short reflections and hymns finishing at

the Methodist Church for Hot Cross buns. This is a lovely opportunity to stand side by side with our fellow sisters and brothers in Christ from the churches in Croxley Green as our Christian witness to the Croxley Green community.

In the afternoon, at 2pm, we will have a series of reflections in church. The reflections will focus on the possible thoughts and experiences of individuals involved in the crucifixion of Jesus. The time of reflection ends with a simple communion using pre-consecrated wafers.

**Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> April** takes us to Easter Eve and another vigil. This time there is a sense of expectation as we listen to readings, and light candles to reflect Jesus rising from the dead, his light coming back into the world. It is a reflective service where we watch and wait and then dare to believe that Jesus has risen from the dead.

**Easter Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> April**, is our great celebration of Jesus rising from the dead. This year we are invited, like Mary on the first Easter Day, to get up early in the morning and join fellow Christians as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus at a Sunrise Service on The Green. It will be led by members of the Baptist Church; more details of the start time will be available nearer the time. We will also have our own service at 9.45am, a joyous service as we celebrate Jesus' victory over death and we proclaim Alleluia! Christ is risen; he is risen indeed ALLELUIA!

After the service we have our traditional Easter Egg Hunt for children in the church garden.

With my love and prayers for a holy and blessed Lent and a joyful Easter.



## All in the month of March

It was:

300 years ago, on 26<sup>th</sup> March 1726 that Sir John Vanbrugh, architect and playwright died. Best known for designing Blenheim Palace and Castle Howard.

250 years ago, on 24<sup>th</sup> March 1776 that John Harrison, carpenter and clockmaker died. Known for inventing the marine chronometer, which enabled sailors to calculate longitude at sea.

150 years ago, on 10<sup>th</sup> March 1876 that the world's first telephone call was made. Alexander Graham Bell used his telephone to call his assistant, Thomas Watson, after spilling acid in his laboratory. The first words ever spoken on a telephone were: "Mr Watson, come here. I want you."

100 years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> March 1926 that Ingvar Kamprad, Swedish businessman, was born. He founded IKEA, the furniture retail company, in 1943, when he was just 17 years old. (Died 2018)

80 years ago, on 25<sup>th</sup> March 1946 that London's Heathrow Airport first opened as London Airport. It was renamed Heathrow Airport in 1966.

75 years ago, on 15<sup>th</sup> March 1951 that Dennis the Menace first appeared in the British children's comic, *The Beano*.

40 years ago, on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1986 that Queen Elizabeth II signed the Australia Act, severing Australia's remaining legal ties with Britain and granting it full independence.

25 years ago, on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2001 that the UK Post Office was rebranded as Consignia, at a cost of around £2million. The name was so unpopular that the following year it was renamed The Royal Mail Group.

20 years ago, on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2006 that the Senedd – the National Assembly for Wales's debating chamber – was officially opened by Queen Elizabeth II in Cardiff.

Also 20 years ago, on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2006 that Twitter, the online social networking/micro-blogging service, was founded. Its website went live on 15<sup>th</sup> July that year.

10 years ago, on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2016 that Ronnie Corbett, Scottish films and tv comedian, actor, screenwriter and broadcaster (*The Two Ronnies*) died.

## **20<sup>th</sup> March : Saint Cuthbert beloved monk and bishop of Lindisfarne**

Cuthbert of Lindisfarne (c 634-87) has long been northern England's favourite saint. It is easy to see why: Cuthbert was holy, humble, peaceable, prayerful, faithful in friendship, winsome, and really kind.

Cuthbert was born into a fairly well-off Anglo-Saxon family, and he became a monk at Melrose in 651. He and another monk, Eata, were sent to start a monastery at Ripon, but Alcfrith, who owned the land, insisted that they adopt the Roman customs, which Cuthbert's Celtic church did not allow. So, Cuthbert and Eata quietly returned to Melrose, where Cuthbert became prior in about 661. Then came the Synod of Whitby in 663/4, and the Celtic Church formally decided to adopt the Roman customs. After this, Cuthbert was sent on to Lindisfarne as prior, where he sensitively introduced the new ways, and won over the monks there.

Cuthbert was very much loved at Lindisfarne. His zeal was evident in his constant preaching, teaching, and visiting of the people. He was also said to have gifts of prophecy and healing. Occasionally, Cuthbert reached 'people overload'. Then he would retreat to a tiny islet called Inner Farne, where he could pray in total seclusion. When, to his horror, he was told he had been made Bishop of Hexham, he immediately 'swapped' sees with Eata, and stayed on at Lindisfarne as Bishop. Sadly, Cuthbert died on little Inner Farne, only two years later, on 20 March, 687.

Cuthbert was buried at Lindisfarne, but that is not the end of his story. For it was only now that his travels began. After the Vikings destroyed Lindisfarne in 875, several monks dug him up and set out to find Cuthbert a final, and safe, resting place. For the next 120 years Cuthbert was deposited in various monasteries around the north of England and southwest Scotland. Finally, in 999, Cuthbert was allowed to rest in Durham, where a Saxon church was built over his shrine.

All that travel must have done him good; when his body was exhumed to be put into the 'new' Norman Cathedral in Durham in 1104, it was said to be still in perfect tact, and 'incorrupt'.



## Church Electoral Roll Revision 2026

The annual revision of the Church Electoral Roll will be made during the week of Monday 6<sup>th</sup> to Friday 10<sup>th</sup> April in preparation for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2026, following the morning service.

If you are a lay person, baptised, are aged 16 years or older and resident in the Parish, or, if not resident, you attend services at All Saints', you are eligible to be on the Electoral Roll as a lay member. Existing members will remain on the Roll unless they signify their wish to withdraw. Application forms for enrolment with an information pack will be available in the Church and the Parish Office from Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> March onwards or can be obtained from me (contact details below).

Being on the Electoral Roll is important as it signifies a commitment to membership of All Saints' and enables you to vote for the election of members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and the Deanery Synod at the APCM and also to stand for election yourself. The PCC works with the Vicar to serve and run the Parish; it appoints committees and groups to manage particular areas such as worship, buildings and social and fundraising activities.

If you wish to be included on the Electoral Roll, please complete a form which you will find in a pack at the back of the Church or obtain one from the office. Please place your completed form in a sealed envelope or hand it to Revd. Miriam, to me or to Judith in the Parish Office on or before Friday 27<sup>th</sup> March.

The revised Electoral Roll will be available for your perusal at the back of the Church for two weeks commencing Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> April, prior to the APCM.



