Your Churchwardens write:

Dear Friends,

In our June/July magazine, Miriam said her farewell to us all and we looked back with thanks on all she has done for the members of All Saints' Church and for the Parish of Croxley Green. The morning Parish Communion service on Sunday 19th July was one of mixed emotions as Miriam encouraged us to look forwards to the journey ahead, building on all that God has enabled us to do together during her ministry.

The afternoon Songs of Praise service was a wonderful way to thank God for all that Miriam had given us in the course of her almost 19 years of service as our Vicar here at All Saints' Church, although it was hard to stop Miriam from thanking us for supporting her! The Church was bursting with people of all ages and all periods of her ministry: young adults that Miriam had baptized in her early years here, members of the congregation who had moved away and had travelled back for this day (from Chester, Hampshire and Shropshire); and of course, the present members of our congregation, whether recently joined or those who have 'journeyed' through all her 19 years - and before! Also there were past and present clergy from the Rickmansworth Deanery, in particular, St Oswald's, and from Croxley Churches Together. So many members from our Friday café and the wider community came to show their appreciation for all that Miriam has meant to them either as individuals or for her support of their community projects.

Everyone simply wanted to say *THANK YOU Miriam*, and we continue to wish her well in all that she does next.

Further in the magazine are photos and reflections on that very special day, beautifully rounded off with Afternoon Tea in the garden. A day which will not be forgotten.

In July, a Parish Vacancy meeting was held, led by Archdeacon Charles Hudson and our Rural Dean, Revd. Charles Burch. It was well attended and we learned about the lengthy process of seeking and appointing a new incumbent.

We discussed three questions :

- What is great about All Saints’?
- What are the challenges, what are the dreams?
- What are we looking for in our next incumbent?

The discussion arising from these questions, together with telling the story of our Church in words and photos, is now forming an important document called the Parish Profile being prepared by a small group. Once the draft is approved by Archdeacon Charles and the Rural Dean, the Parish Profile will then be presented at a special meeting of the PCC called ‘Section 11 Meeting’ at which it must be agreed. Please pray for everyone involved in this work, and for all who are supporting us in this vacancy.

The hottest summer on record has made it a challenging one for us all. Let’s hope that the month of September will be cooler and will bring some much-needed rain to re-hydrate the earth. September is the month when we celebrate Harvest. We are mindful that the harvest this year has been a difficult one for many farmers. It has been a struggle to feed livestock and it may well have an impact on prices in the future. For most of us, this is something we can adjust to but, sadly, the rise in prices can tip people into poverty. The Rickmansworth and Croxley foodbanks are vital in supporting local people and families in this predicament. This year our Harvest Festival will take place at 9.45am on Sunday 20th September. Once again, we invite you to bring Harvest goods to support the Foodbank. A list of goods most needed can be found in this magazine.

Apart from our worship times, there are many activities and events happening in September and in the coming months. You will find out all about them in this magazine. Please do come along to all that you can.

It's a very fond farewell to Simon Dunn

Sunday 26th July saw us saying farewell to organist Simon Dunn. More accurately perhaps, we heard his farewell to us after six years as one of our two organists. ...and a main stay of the effort to restore the church organ: now in better shape than it has been for nearly 40 years.



Simon was born in Bury St Edmunds Sussex in 1965 where his father was County Solicitor and in time Clerk to the Cathedral Chapter, and his brother Head Chorister in the Cathedral Choir. Having been 'educated' unhappily at AllHallows boarding schools at Lyme Regis in Dorset and Seaton in Devon, he left with "no love of education" and the idea of being a teacher far from his ambitions, "the last job I'd have wanted." But he did love music and had begun playing the piano again which he had done at home, and aged 16 began to learn the organ.

Now thinking that teaching might be a rather good way to put his love of music to use he attended a two-year foundation course in Cambridge followed by four years at St Katherine's Anglican Teacher Training College in Liverpool from 1985-1989 playing the organ in the College Chapel, and meeting his wife to be, Kath, who was the Chapel Sacristan. She later taught children with Dyslexia, including among her pupils, Singer-songwriter Robbie Williams of 'Take That.' Simon began his own teaching – in elementary schools in Liverpool - - before crossing the Pennines to Fulneck School, an independent day and boarding school, in the Fulneck Moravian Settlement in Pudsey, West Yorkshire, named for Fulnek in Czechoslovakia. The Moravian Church is one of the oldest protestant denominations, dating back to the Bohemian Reformation of the mid 15th century, a community-centred faith based on a personal heart-felt relationship with Jesus rather on theological dogma. The settlement was founded in 1744 by Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, a Moravian Bishop and Lutheran priest, following a donation of land by evangelical Anglican clergyman, Benjamin Ingham. Simon joined the school as 'boarding

master and music teacher’ – “a dream because I was given complete freedom” The freedom included the chance to play the organ at a nearby Anglican church, although he became well absorbed into the life of this very different religious community. The school, regrettably, closed in July last year ending 272 years of unusually interesting Yorkshire educational history.

Simon moved from Fulneck to become deputy head of the co-educational Lady Lane Park prep school in Bingley, then to the headship of the junior school at William Hulme’s Grammar School in Manchester, and then back in Yorkshire, this time to be Head of Bronte House School in Apperley Bridge, Rawdon in Bradford about which it is also well worth saying a word about, as the name suggests, its (rather tenuous) link to the Brontes. The school sits on the site of the former Ashdown House built in the grounds of Upperwood House. Ashdown House had been built around 1770 and bought from the Picard family by Revd. William Carus Wilson another wealthy evangelical clergyman (and landowner). He knew that the poorer clergy could not afford to educate their daughters (priority being given to their sons) and established a school in Ashdown House affordable to them. The school’s links with the Bronte’s is only indirect. Despite it being later named Bronte House School, through claimed links, the Bronte sisters were not educated there but at the apparently dreadful Clergy Daughters School at Cowan Bridge in Lancashire, which provided the model for the appalling Lowood School in Jane Eyre. The Bronte link is in fact with Upperwood House (not Ashdown) where Charlotte worked as a governess.

And, finally, from Bronte to St Martin’s Northwood. To begin with, a bit reluctant to up sticks from Yorkshire (who wouldn’t be?) “for a London school that’s all boys and very academic” he says an incentive to come for

the interview was “a catch-up with my best friend who lives in Northwood” -- where Kath and he live on site opposite the house used for the 70s sitcom, *The Good Life*.



In any free time left over from his headship, running a school choir and playing the organ in local churches, happily including All Saints' he sings, a 'fair baritone' and polishes and, it is to be hoped, finds time to drive his classic car, his other enthusiasm. And so back to Pudsey and Yorkshire – God's own country!



Thanks for being a part of All Saints' these last 6 years Simon. The Church has been lucky to have you.

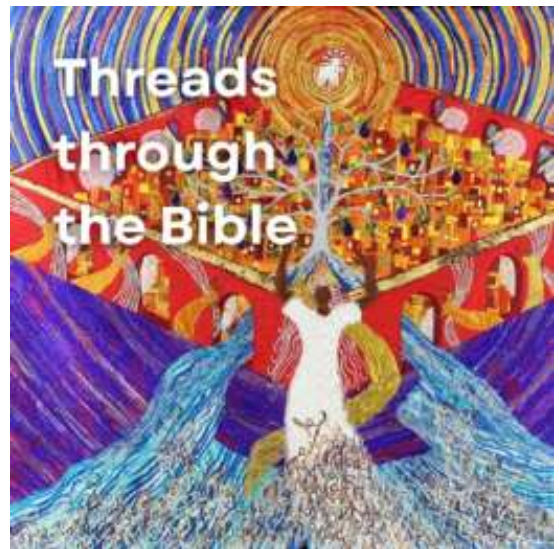

Threads Through the Bible

Over the summer a friend, who is a keen needlewoman, told me about an exhibition that is travelling around the country, and gave me the beautiful picture book, for adults and children, that shows the huge panels by textile artist Jacqui Parkinson and tells the story of Creation. I haven't yet managed to see the exhibition but am hoping to before it ends.



'Threads through the Bible' is an extraordinary display of three huge textile panels, 'Threads through Creation', 'Threads through the Cross' and 'Threads through Revelation' that has been travelling around the country.

This is probably not only the largest textile project by a single artist, Jacqui Parkinson, but also the largest textile project for 600 years. It is astonishing in its scale and variety.

It will have taken ten years, and used more than 25 million stitches. There are 44 panels. If they were presented side by side they would stretch more than 80 metres.

The premiere was at Liverpool Cathedral in January 2025 and is now touring a further ten venues, taking us to the end of 2027.

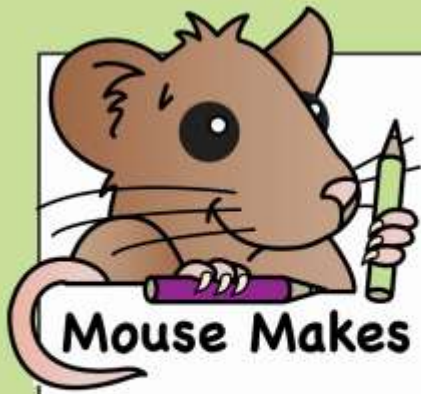
